Scottish Challenger Traveller Series 2023 Qualifier T2

13 and 14 May 2023

1 Organising Authority

1.1 The Organising Authority is North Lanarkshire Water Sports Centre in association with Sailability Scotland SCIO.

2 Rules

- 2.1 Racing will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021 2024 (RRS), the prescriptions of the RYA, the Challenger Class Rules, the Notice of Race and such other local rules In the event of a conflict, these Sailing Instructions shall override the Notice of Race.
- 2.2 All Challengers must have a grab line of free specification fixed to each sponson and a tow line of free specification fixed to the bow and long enough to be led back to the cockpit and handled by the sailor.

A Challenger Hull is defined thus - "A boat's Hull shall consist of a central main hull, plus left and right-hand sponsons bolted together with two aluminium tubular crossbeams".

Racing Rules will be changed as follows:

- 2.3 Rule 27.1 & 40, Personal Buoyancy shall be worn at all times whilst on or near the water.
- 2.4 Rule 41, outside help is modified to permit a boat to receive outside help from an official patrol boats for any reason other than added propulsion.
- 2.5 Rule 44.1, taking a penalty modified from two turns to one turn for RRS Part 2 infringements
- 2.6 Rule 49, crew position modified so that helm and buddy should remain seated in their normal positions within the main hull or on a buddy seat except in an emergency.
- 2.7 Rules 29.1, 29.2 and Racing Signals Recalls See SI 11.3 and Appendix 1B.

3 Notices to Competitors

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located within the club house dining area.

4 Changes to Sailing Instructions

4.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the official noticeboard at least 1 hour before the warning signal on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 16.00 on the day before it will take effect.

5 Signals made Ashore

- 5.1 Signals made will be displayed from the committee boat.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with '30 minutes' in the "Race Signals, AP"

6 Schedule of Races

- 6.1 Racing will take place on Saturday the 13th of May and Sunday the 14th of May 2023
- 6.2 Registration Competitors registration will take place from 9:00am to 9:45am in the dining hall at the club house.

6.3 Schedule

Briefing will take place at 10:00am in the dining hall at the club house.

The event will be a five race regatta held over two days

- 6.4 Back to back races should have the approval of all the sailors.
- 6.5 The above schedule may be adjusted dependent on prevailing weather conditions and forecast. In this case a change to the SI will be posted and all competitors will be informed. However the start of the first race each day will not be any earlier that stated here.

7 Class Flag

7.1 The **Challenger** Class Flag will be - will be advised at the briefing.

8 Racing Area

8.1 The racing area and any known hazards or obstructions will be advised at the briefing.

9 The Course

The course for the day will be advised at the pre-race briefing.

10 Marks

- 10.1 Marks and course will be advised at the briefing. (See Appendix 1A).
- 10.2 Committee and official patrol boats will be identified at the briefing.

11 The Start

- 11.1 Races will be started using rule 26 (i.e. 5, 4, 1, go) warning signal 5 minutes before the starting signal. (Described in Appendix 1B). Times shall be taken from the visual signals not the sound signal. The failure of a sound signal shall be disregarded.
- 11.2 The Starting Line will be identified on the day at the pre-race briefing.
- 11.3 General Recalls (This is a change to RRS Signals). Individual Recall Class Flag + 1 Sound Signal replaces Flag X. General Recall Class Flag + 2 Sound signals replaces First Substitute Flag. (Described in Appendix 1B).

12 The Finish

12.1 The finish line will be identified on the day at the pre-race briefing.

13 Time Limit

- 13.1 The target time for the leading boat to complete each race is 40 minutes.
- 13.2 There will be no time limit for boats' finishing after the first boat has finished
- 13.3 In order to minimise excessive delays between races: After the first boats have finished, boat(s) may be finished on a leg if the Race Committee points Flag W at her. This changes RRS 28, 35, A4 and A5. The race officer will award appropriate finishing position(s). Affected boat(s) should return to the starting area immediately. The race officer's decision is final and will not provide grounds for a competitor to seek redress, this changes rule 62.

14 Protests

- 14.1 The Exoneration Penalty (and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration Procedures) of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available and a summary will be posted on the Official Notice Board. The penalty will be a loss of a minimum two places but shall not result in a score worse than DNF.
- 14.2 Protests will be made directly to the race committee within the appropriate time limit.
- 14.3 The protest limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day.
- 14.4 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or witnesses. Location of hearings will be identified on the notice.

15 Scoring

- 15.1 The scoring system to be used will be as in RRS Appendix A using the Low Point system.
- 15.2 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series
- 15.3 When up to 3 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores
- 15.4 When 4 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 15.5 Race results will be scored in overall finishing order regardless of fleet. Gold, Silver and Bronze Fleet results may be extracted for prize giving purposes they shall be extracted from overall results and not scored separately.

16 Declarations and Tally

16.1 Boats retiring must inform race official's as soon as practicable.

17 Radio Communication

17.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

18 Prizes

18.1 Awards will be made to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each fleet and at the discretion of the Race Committee.

19 Visual Image Consent

Competitors automatically grant the Organising Authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of, or relating to, the Regatta, unless the Authority is advised otherwise in writing prior to the Regatta.

20 Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 3, Decision to Race and also the disclaimers on the Notice of Race and Entry Form. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

21 Insurance

The boat is required to hold adequate insurance and in particular to hold insurance against third party claims in the sum of at least £3,000,000.
